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DNP NURSE-MIDWIFERY

The Nurse-Midwifery track is a 75-credit hour curriculum combining academic preparation with clinical experiences for the independent health care management of women and newborns that acknowledges the family's importance. Students are prepared to provide holistic and individualized care to women throughout the lifespan, from menarche into and including menopause, while implementing the midwifery model of care. This is an online program with required on-campus and virtual immersions. Our program is committed to the education of nurse-midwives in a unique Christian environment. Enrolling diverse and qualified students that embrace diversity, equality, and inclusion and who will focus their service on caring for vulnerable populations is a priority.

Graduates from the nurse-midwifery program are eligible to take the midwifery national certification examination offered by the American Midwifery Certification Board (AMCB). The program of study conforms to educational guidelines from the Texas Board of Nursing, The Essentials of Doctoral Education for Advanced Nursing Practice (AACN, 2021) and the American College of Nurse Midwives (ACNM), Accreditation Commission for Midwifery Education (ACME). Admissions Requirements for the DNP Nurse-Midwifery

Admission requirements for the BSN to DNP in NM:

For admission, applicants must meet the general requirements set forth by the Graduate School and the Louise Herrington School of Nursing.

Admissions criteria for BSN to DNP at the time of application:

- Completed BSN with a nursing GPA of 3.0 or higher. Applicants who attend a program that issued Pass or Fail (P/F) grades or Complete or Incomplete (C/I) for all classes will not be a competitive applicant.
- 2. One year experience as a registered nurse in labor & delivery, mother-baby unit or in an Outpatient OB/GYN
- 3. Unencumbered and current RN license
- Three letters of recommendation from: an immediate supervisor, one from a peer registered nurse, and one from an MSN/APP, DNP, PhD prepared nurse or MD/DO.
- 5. An acceptable writing sample using your own words.
- 6. There is no foreign language requirement.

Admission requirements for Post-Master's DNP in NM without an APRN role change:

- 1. Master's degree with APRN certification.
- 2. Unencumbered APRN license.
- 3. Cumulative Master's GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Documentation of successful completion (grade of B or better) of a health-related graduate level statistics course prior to matriculation in the program.

- 5. Acceptable writing sample in your own words.
- Three letters of recommendation from: an immediate supervisor, one must be from a peer registered nurse, and one from an MSN/APP, DNP, or PhD prepared nurse or MD/DO.
- 7. There is no foreign language requirement.
