The requirements governing the selection of courses and clinical practicum experiences must be individualized based on when a student begins the program and the courses that he or she takes. Therefore, all students must consult with the Graduate Program Director for guidance in fulfilling the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association's standards.

Admissions

Admission decisions are based on faculty review of undergraduate transcripts, the cumulative undergraduate (or graduate if degree conferred) GPA from a degree-bearing university, personal statements, a resume, and three letters of recommendation. Students who earned their primary undergraduate degree with a major in CSD are admitted in the fall, spring, and summer semesters. Leveling students who do not have an undergraduate degree with a major in CSD are admitted in the fall semester.

Policies and operating procedures for the graduate program are detailed in the Residential CSD Graduate Handbook and provided to each student electronically at the start of the semester.
