The BA degree in Anthropology with a concentration in Archaeology will prepare students for graduate studies in archaeology and related fields or entry-level employment in the cultural resource management sector.

Coursework in the Department of Anthropology and related disciplines will provide a solid foundation in archaeological theory and exposure to the resources, techniques, and analyses used by archaeologists. Students will participate in a 6-hour archeological field school, offering hands-on training in archaeological survey, excavation, and analysis.
